November 2021

Progress: St. Mark's is inching its way toward a closing date for the sale of our beloved 147 West Main St. church building and property to Deeper Life Bible Church. It may well have happened by the time you read this. We owe many thanks to Father Shaw, Stephen Hard, and the Vestry for supplying the numerous legal documents necessary. We also may be thankful for Stephen Hard's efficient organization of and advertising for our rummage sale. (We raised \$725) Bishop Ian Douglas performed a secularization service on Nov. 6th which gave us some closure.

Now we can move forward with the things we do best.

1. We will have a Christmas Eve service in-person (and Zoom) in Erwin Chapel at 6 p.m. Albert Tomasso and his sister, Lucy, will play the organ and sing Christmas hymns. (Parameters: We are not in a Covid red zone and we have a team of volunteers to disinfect the chapel following the service.)
2. Community Ministry is busy. St. Mark's has been invited to participate in providing drivers for Afghan refugees and food donations for both the New Britain Police Christmas dinner and South Church's Christmas dinner. South Church is also collecting warm coats and clothing to distribute.
3. The Nominating Committee is seeking volunteers for the 2022 vestry and the Delegate to the diocesan convention (as a delegate, you could vote for our new bishop in the May election!)
4. St. Mark's Future Committee (vestry members currently but anyone is welcome to join) has met with Father George of St. James, Farmington and his vestry for an informal gathering. With the sale of our building and Father Shaw leaving, we are looking at all our options. Before the pandemic, we had started visiting area churches to see if there was an opportunity for shared ministry (possibly a merger many months down the road). We had a lovely time at St. James and they are willing to work with us. Shared worship? Shared ministry? Please let the vestry know what you think—better yet, join the committee!

Ultimately, God's enduring love is our constant. And that appears every day in our love for each other.

Our services will *always* be available on Zoom with Meeting ID 500-865-037. You can enter via the parish Web link at <http://www.stmarksnewbritain.org>. The bulletin is also available on our website. Please either print or have the bulletin open on a separate browser tab to participate fully in the service.

If New Britain is red on the weekly Thursday (about 3 p.m.) update on the Connecticut COVID-19 Data Tracker map, the Sunday service will be on Zoom only.

An e-mail will be sent out to the parish every Friday to let you know if the service will be in-person or on ***Zoom only***.

For in-person services at 90 Main St., everyone is required to wear a mask and maintain a safe distance inside the buildings of South Church. We will have masks available if you need one. Thank you.

Broadcast Instructions

You can enter the Zoom service via the parish Web link at <http://www.stmarksnewbritain.org>.

There is also a telephone number that can be used to join the Zoom service:

(phone charges may apply for the telephone call if you do not have unlimited calling).

If you are using a telephone to dial into the service: dial the zoom phone number, and then wait to be prompted by the voice to enter the meeting number. Then, enter the meeting number, and as part of the meeting number, please add the "pound" sign (#) at the end of the meeting number (as the verbal instructions direct).

The Zoom broadcast opens at 9:45 am when remote participants can be admitted and will be greeted by the e-verger.

Remote participants are encouraged to stay connected after the service and greet and be greeted during the coffee hour.

Response: you may be in "speaker" view. If so, change to "gallery view".
