### THE LION'S PAUSE with MOLLY SHERMAN

Hoping for some ideas for my Lion's Pause, I scrolled through a bunch of old St. Mark's files on my computer. There were --

Harvest Dinners Police Faith Academy Food for the Spirit New Britain Bees Baseball Blessing Confirmation Pancake Suppers Adult Forum Walking With Jesus Lenten Soup Suppers and so many more!

There were dozens of files on dozens of different committees, projects, and activities. St. Mark's was a real happenin' place!

Well, St. Mark's WAS a real happenin' place. It made me a little sad to see all those projects and activities and committees that don't even exist any more. On the other hand, WE exist. We are still here.

Over the past several years, I've been through a lot of sadness in my life. My mother died after fighting cancer for 10 years. Then my dad was also diagnosed with cancer, and was gone in a few short weeks. My sisters and I took over my dad's shop and ran it for two years, necessitating my absence from home and family - and St. Mark's - for a lot of that time. After we closed the shop, I was diagnosed with cancer, and had a total colostomy/ileostomy. My husband and I separated after 40 years of marriage, and I moved out of the family home in which I raised my 3 children. 

There were Lenny and Stephen, plotting our course, and faithful parishioners rowing steadily and keeping us afloat. There was my place in the boat, and my oars, ready for me to pick up and start rowing.

The waves are still a challenge. Rowing is harder work than I thought it would be. There are even fewer boats out here on the briny than there used to be. (Seems like more cruise ships, maybe...)

But we're still here, we're still rowing, and Jesus is still urging us to have faith. And, even, to step out of the boat.


