How did you get to be in need? by Barbara A. Campbell, Ph.D. Treasurer

Humor a retired English teacher with no papers to grade – think about a larger meaning of the first person plural pronoun, "WE". I know you are muttering, "This is why I hated English!"

How have WE changed? Not just St. Mark's people but people in downtown New Britain and in the state.

Most of us learned what the circumstances of a recipient should be when there is assistance offered to someone in need. We learned about those circumstances <u>before</u> we were hit by Covid. Hear how "in need" has changed.

One of the Valley newspapers is thrown in my driveway every Wednesday. It is their way of getting the Stop & Shop, Big Y, Ocean State sales and coupons to me. In that newspaper, they said, "In Connecticut, more than 600 restaurants have closed." Let that sink in – "In Connecticut, more than 600 restaurants have closed." That's not just cooks and waitresses and bus boys out of work. It's the cleaning crew that comes in at night. It's the drivers of the delivery trucks that brought the chicken, the veggies, the coffee, tea bags, fortune cookies. It's the people who loaded those trucks, the college student earning a little money after class, the mother or father holding 3 jobs trying to support a family... It's not a simple matter of stopping work at Restaurant A to going to work next door at Restaurant B.

Or think about it another way. I use one credit card for travel and restaurants. For months now, the bill for that card has been coming to my home saying I owe a zero balance – haven't been any place and haven't eaten out. I'm contributing to the change in circumstances that the "600 restaurants closed" reality creates. I imagine you are, too.

Or one more marker, my friends, all retired teachers, used to meet every Friday night for supper at Nordstrom's and then go downstairs in Westfarms Mall to use one of their tables to play Rummikub. Once we realized we could be infecting each other with something lethal, we stopped going. One news report recently said the last nail in the coffin of malls could be Covid.

All of which is to say the ways of thinking when it's appropriate for a

#### A WORD FROM FR. SHAW MUDGE

Dear friends,

In the midst of preparing for Christmas services and everything else, Cheryl gently reminded me of an opportunity to write an article for the Message.

Yet, as I prayed about it, I thought, "what better time than now? Later, could be more challenging."

As we look to 2021, God may be prompting us all to engage in something that at first may appear to be inconvenient, and yet may be important. This is COVID life. This is also life without COVID.

There is a faint wisp of optimism in the air at the moment, because the first vaccines have been injected. Six weeks yet to go until the full effect takes place for these folks, yet the beginning of the conquest of the virus is upon us. December 2020

The Covid-19 pandemic continues at an increasingly fast pace, but there is hope as vaccines are approved and distribution begins. Our outlook is to continue remotely with worship and mission at least until June of 2021.

#### St. Mark's Agenda:

- 1. Our Annual Meeting will by 2/7/21 (Zoom/Skype/Phone) beginning at 9:30 a.m. with worship and continuing as needed for the election of Vestry and other business.
- 2. Nominations are sought for all vestry positions. Please consider joining.
- 3. At the ECCT Annual Convention in October, diocesan canons were updated to allow for virtual meetings and votes. St. Mark's By-Laws do not specifically prohibit virtual meetings so we may go forward with our Annual Meeting plans. We do have a formula to set a specific quorum. We may want to update our by-laws to allow "members present". No change has been made at this point.
- 4. Our stewardship pledge campaign for 2021 has raised \$49,235.88 (37 pledges). If you have not pledged, please consider joining our mission as you are able.
- 5. The New Britain Stop & Shop Community Bag Program will be held this year for the benefit of the St. Mark's Food Pantry. For every "Give Back" bag purchased, \$1 will be given to our pantry.
- 6. St. Mark's has made progress toward becoming a "parish in good standing" since we have not made large withdrawals from our endowment. We still have financial concerns since we have spent most of the rectory sale proceeds and our 147 West Main St. building has not been sold (2 interested parties but no firm offers).
