If you have been muted along with the video people, you may not be aware that you have been muted, so to be heard, please press the "star" and then "6" to unmute.

# Allison's Parish Clerk News Corner June 2021

Happy Summer!

Covid indicators have dropped dramatically in CT. Bishop lan has released a new set of protocols and "strongly encourages all parishes to return to some form of inperson worship" (with appropriate precautions-masks, social distancing, gathering outdoors when possible). He also encourages parishes to maintain their online (Zoom) presence for those who don't feel comfortable gathering in person.

This is wonderful news and St. Mark's is making plans! Here are some highlights:

- 1. July 11<sup>th</sup> is the tentative date for our first in-person service in Cooper Hall. Stephen has tested South Church's internet connection in Cooper Hall and it is reliable. We will be able to have a hybrid service with a Zoom connection. For the moment, we will not have coffee hour. We will be singing *a capella*. (Anyone willing to play the piano??!)
- 2. Our 147 West Main St. sale is progressing. United Chaplains' lender has completed an intensive inspection and we are waiting for the results. If all goes well, the closing is scheduled for August 18<sup>th,</sup> and we plan to have a farewell/thanksgiving ante-communion service in our courtyard on Sunday August 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 3. Transition and change are key words to describe St. Mark's future. What is our financial status? Who will serve as clergy after Father Shaw finishes his time with us in February 2022? Where will we worship? Should we consider merging with another parish as we decided before the pandemic? St. Mark's Future Committee (currently only vestry members) needs your help! We have met once. Please join us. Contact Cheryl or Lenny for details.
- 4. Help again! 147 West Main St. has lots of "stuff" (useful and not!) stored in the choir room and safe. We need a contingent to help sort and move. Please contact Cheryl or Lenny for details.
- 5. Our food pantry received \$130 from May flower sales at Stop & Shop and will receive \$1/special tote bag sold in June. Mark continues to pick up donations there and from his neighborhood network.
- 6. The 2021 New Britain Ability Walk & Roll will take place on July 21<sup>st</sup> at 5 p.m. in Walnut Hill Park near the Darius Miller Band Shell. It will be followed by a free concert by "Shaded Soul". St. Mark's will have its famous booth with ice cream sundaes and prayer requests. Volunteers needed! Please contact Cheryl or Allison.
